Place garbage at your garbage collection point by 8:30 in the morning.

The garbage collection times for each collection point vary due to local traffic conditions and the amount of garbage to be collected.

Disposal Method	Use the bag specified for burnable garbage <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Food waste Wooden products (that can be placed in a garbage bag) Ashes Vinyl Products CDs and DVDs Paper Cartons (Less than 500 ml) Chlorine Detergents (Including those with the PLA mark), etc. Paper scraps Shoes Straws Stuffed Animals Video Tape Plastic Products without the PLA Mark Paper diapers Weeds, leaves, branches Underwear Rubber Products Cassette Tapes  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Water from food waste should be adequately drained. Waste inside paper diapers should be removed. Ashes should be lightly wetted with water and placed in a transparent bag. Long items such as hoses should be cut into 1m-long pieces. A garbage bag completely covered with anything that prevents seeing inside cannot be collected. A garbage bag containing items that are completely wrapped with something that prevents seeing inside cannot be collected. (excluding food waste and sanitary goods). Metal caps and tin cans are ③ Metals. Empty cans used for beverages should not be crushed. Broken bottles are ③ Unburnable Garbage. Bottles and empty cans used for beverages should be placed in the same bag. Milky white cosmetic bottles are ③ Unburnable Garbage. Jars for making pickles and fruit wine are ③ Unburnable Garbage.

<p>* Prevent items from becoming wet. Wet items are impossible to recycle. Please refrain from disposing items on rainy days. If it is unavoidable to dispose of items on rainy days, wrap them with transparent or semitransparent bags and leave the tops untied. Do not directly place adhesives such as duct tape on the items.</p>

Stapled fliers are ③ Magazines & Books 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paper packages should be washed out, cut and opened, and tied. Paper packages whose inside is covered with aluminum foil are ① Burnable Garbage. Paper packages with a capacity of less than 500ml are ③ Burnable Garbage. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not mix magazines and fliers. Used paper that cannot be tied should be placed in transparent bags. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cardboard should be flattened and tied. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Oil cans, tin cans, etc. should be washed out. Spray cans should be emptied, and then completely discharged by puncturing the can. Gas should be completely emptied from lighters before disposal. Electrical cords should be cut into 50cm-long pieces. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Only still usable items are accepted. Damaged or stained items, or items containing cotton or down (ivory coats, etc.) are ③ Burnable Garbage. Underwear is ③ Burnable Garbage. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fluorescent tubes and light bulbs that are not damaged should either be brought to the Sakanoue Unburnable Transfer Facility or placed in the collection box at the Living Environment Department. Makeup compacts with a mirror (including those with a PLA mark) are ③ Burnable Garbage.

Disposal Method	③ Oversized Garbage Items Larger than Garbage Bags Designated by the Town <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Furniture Cooking stoves Glass doors Electric carpets Tin sheets Beddings Tatami mats Home electric appliances Corrugated sheets Stoves, etc. Bicycles Child car sheets Electric fans Glass sheets  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bring the garbage directly to the Sakanoue Unburnable Transfer Facility (shown right). If the item placed in a designated disposal bag cannot be tied crosswise, it is considered oversized garbage. Cords for home electrical appliances should be cut into 50 cm-long pieces. (⑤ Metals) Pruned branches should be cut into 80 cm-long pieces and tied with 1m string. Tatami mats should be cut into thirds. Tin and corrugated sheets should be cut into 80 cm-long pieces and tied with a string. 
Cautions






- This facility is open to Kawaminami Town residents only.
- Please separate garbage in accordance with the rules specified by the town before bringing it to the facility.
- Register your name and address at the reception counter, and follow the directions provided by the staff.
- The Sakanoue Unburnable Garbage Transfer Facility will not accept garbage from individuals who have not registered, garbage that has not been separated, or garbage containing items not accepted by the town.
- Garbage left at or around the facility after service hours is deemed illegal disposal. Violators are subject to prosecution.
- Commercial garbage is not accepted by this facility.
- Garbage bags designated by the town and Oversized Garbage Disposal Tickets are not available at the Sakanoue Unburnable Garbage Transfer Facility. Please purchase these items at a store near you.
- Contact the Living Environment Department for details about the Sakanoue Unburnable Garbage Transfer Facility.

Acceptable Items

- Garbage that falls under any of ③ to ⑦.
- (Food waste is accepted only on Sundays.)
- Fluorescent tubes, light bulbs, and dry cells

<p>Kawaminami Town does not collect items subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Act. There are two disposal methods, as shown below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> When replacing an item, arrange with the place of purchase to dispose of the item being replaced. Purchase a Home Appliance Recycling Ticket at a post office, and ask a service provider designated by the manufacturer of the item to arrange for disposal. <p>Home appliance recycling fees must be paid. Contact the Living Environment Department for details.</p> 	<p>Kawaminami Town does not accept computers for disposal. Contact the manufacturer to arrange for recycling. The manufacturer will send you an "Eco Yu-Pack Payment Slip." Affix the slip to the packaged computer to be disposed, and ask the nearest post office for pickup or bring the item to the post office.</p> <p>*Recycling fees must be paid for a computer without a PC Recycling Mark.</p> 	<p>Kawaminami Town collects oversized garbage from individual households. This service is available for individuals aged 67 or older, or individuals with a Handicapped Person's Passbook, who do not own or cannot rent a car to transport oversized garbage to an intermediate facility. Please contact the Living Environment Department for details.</p> 	<p>Fluorescent tubes, light bulbs, and dry cells cannot be placed at garbage collection sites. Please bring these items to the Sakanoue Unburnable Transfer Facility or place them in the collection box at the Living Environment Department. Broken fluorescent tubes and light bulbs should be disposed of as Unburnable Garbage.</p> <p>The town does not collect button cells.</p> <p>* A designated garbage bag is not necessary.</p> 	<p>Contact the Living Environment Department for the disposal of iron plates, hammers, iron dumbbells, tire chains, chains whose thickness is greater than 6 mm, bowling balls, etc.</p> 	<p>Garbage generated through business activities (including agriculture, fishery, wholesale) cannot be placed at garbage collection sites, town collection boxes, or the Sakanoue Unburnable Transfer Facility.</p> <p>Please ask a service provider with license of transporting wastes for the disposal.</p>
